**QUOTE OF THE MONTH:** “*I object to fishing tournaments. Not so much for what they do to fish but what they do to fishermen.*”

Ted Williams (paraphrased)

This month's quote is by the greatest hitter of a baseball in history, not the **Ted Williams** who writes conservation articles for Fly Rod and Reel magazine. Williams the hitter, due to his incredible eyesight it is believed, also became one of the most accomplished fly fisherman in the world.

I've always agreed with Ted on the subject of fishing tournaments. Fishing competition just doesn't feel right to me, especially competitive fly fishing. But whether we know it or not, we probably all do it. Do we count fish for curiosity; or so we can fill in a catch report for the local Fish and Game; or do we do it to best our fishing companions; to let them know how much better we are? When you've caught a fish, and your boat mate has eight, how do you feel? How many times have you been asked by a buddy, "how many?" My standard answer to that question is "a few." Which, coming from me, can mean anywhere from one to 20 or more. I don't believe I ever said a few when I was getting skunked. I hope not anyway.

Now, after being a tournament critic my entire fly fishing life, I'm in one. Along with a dozen or so other members, organized by **Bruce Michael**, the Club has entered two teams of five anglers each to compete with the other member clubs of the **South West Council International Federation of Fly Fishers** in SWCIFFF's sixth annual fly fishing tournament on the **Kern River**. The grand prize, which we fully intend to win, is our name on a trophy. That's no reason for me (and perhaps others) to break a lifelong objection. So

why am I and the others doing it? The reasons are simply because the entry fees go to SWCIFFF to assist the organization with the many fly fishing causes it supports: a worthy cause. Also, and maybe a better reason, we'll get to meet fly fishers from all around Southern California. Sit around a campfire with new and old friends; smoke a cigar, drink some whiskey, and ask the questions: "How many did you get? What on?"

Speaking of Bruce Michael, if you attended October's meeting, you already know Bruce has taken on the biggest job of all. He, along with his co-chair **Bruce Bechard** ("**The Bruces**") are planning the 2015 Fundraiser. You'll be hearing much more about that in the future, but for now my personal and sincere thanks to The Bruces for stepping up.

And speaking of "stepping up" there have been many members of the Club who over the years have "stepped up." Some of them, like the aforementioned Bruces are still doing so. Some members both past and present have stepped up so often they seem irreplaceable. Will there ever be another **Ned Sewell**, willing to teach fly casting 52 Sundays a year for 20 plus years? Will we ever have another **Lucky Ketcham**, a learned, educated entomologist to teach us fly tying every Thursday; and write long, entertaining fishing journals for us to enjoy. And how about **Paul Woolery**, who will take on any job asked of him, no matter how difficult. There are many, many others who could be cited for their dedication and selflessness, but my purpose in citing the few above is to mention one.



Will we ever find another **Jack Bentle**, who organized, and executed 3-4 Club trips a year for many years (I can't remember how many). The Green, the San Juan, Lee's Ferry were regular stops, and there were others. Jack ran his trips like a military operation. If you attended you knew the cost, where to be, when, who you were fishing with, who your guide would be, and how much to tip. Moreover, Jack's trips were very well attended: sometimes as many as around 20 members joined up.

I know from long experience that organizing a fly fishing trip is very difficult. I've concluded that asking someone to replace Jack and become the Club's travel chairman is likely an exercise in futility. Paul does a great job with Bishop in February. I'd like to see the Club have at least one more annual trip, but for reasons previously cited, we can't ask Paul to do it. My conclusion is we need a *chairman for each trip*. We've had two excellent programs the past two meetings: **the Olympic Peninsula and Southern Utah**. Either of those destinations would make a great Club trip. Southern Utah is drivable and inexpensive. Let's start there.

# Chollas Lake Plan: San Diego Fly Fishers Step-up to Improve the Quality of Fishing for the Youths of San Diego County



Many members of our club may be unaware of the Sunday morning program that Paul Wollery and other members who have been donating their time at Chollas Lake are doing to help kids. They provide lender rods for kids who want to fish and have set-up hula hoop targets in the lake so kids can practice their casting. There are even some small trinkets to award good casters. **This is a program that can use more volunteer help.**

Your club is giving back to the community and Chollas Lake is an important effort to bring kids into the fishing community.

**Chollas Park Lake** is a California Fishing spot. Chollas Lake is a small lake in the middle of the city of San Diego. It actually has a long history that begins in 1901 when the reservoir was created. It was used to supply water to the city until 1966 when it was turned into a park and later a youth fishing lake.



STAR/PAL Fishing

The San Diego Fly Fishers are involved in fostering an alternative activity for the youth of the inner city. We support the STAR/PAL organization by preparing over 350 fishing rods and reel on a Friday afternoon then giving direct support for the kids on Saturday morning. This activity has seen many club members participating on both days. There are other groups that have brought kids to the lake where members have provided support.

The most ambitious project that Paul and Gary Strawn are currently working on is improve the fishing quality of Chollas Lake. This will be accomplished by carefully placing bottom structures that provide a safe place for fish fry to flourish. Many agencies have signed-on to support this project and a few more have to give this project their blessing. There is a possibility that the first structures may be set within the next 12 to 18 months which may generate a call for volunteer help.

## Conservation

### Paiute Cutthroat Trout- An On-going Effort to Save an Endangered Species

Paiute cutthroat trout (*Oncorhynchus clarkii seleniris*), a federally designated threatened species, are native to 19 km of Silver King Creek, in the northern Sierra Nevada mountain range of California. Paiute cutthroat trout evolved in isolation from other fish species.

I U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forest Service and California Department of Fish and Game began a project to implement this recovery action beginning in 2001. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Revised Recovery Plan (2004) for the Paiute Cutthroat Trout identified the elimination of nonnative trout from historic habitat in



Introduced rainbow trout *O. mykiss* and Lahontan cutthroat trout (*O. c. henshawi*) hybridized and displaced pure Paiute cutthroat trout in their native range, leaving only transplanted isolated headwater tributary populations. Unauthorized plants of rainbow trout in headwater tributaries left Paiute cutthroat trout in only two small streams with a few hundred individuals.

The fish was originally listed as endangered in 1967 but reclassified as threatened in 1973 to facilitate management. Chemical treatments have been successful in eliminating introgressed trout from headwater tributary populations. Successful elimination of hybrid trout and the subsequent rebound of these Paiute cutthroat trout populations in headwater tributaries to serve as source populations have set the stage for restoration of Paiute cutthroat trout to their historic range in Silver King Creek.

Silver King Creek as the highest priority recovery action.

Environmental groups opposed to the project have sued over environmental compliance issues and the Regional Water Board at one time refused to provide needed permits. The use of rotenone has become controversial with groups concerned with treatment impacts to non-target organisms and opposed to use of pesticides.

Legal challenges were finally cleared in 2013 and a first year chemical treatment was conducted. A second year treatment was completed in 2014, and results indicate a third and final treatment will be done during 2015. Restocking of pure Paiute cutthroat trout from source populations back into the historic range of the fish will then follow in the long road to recovery.

### SDFP Conservation Update from Gary Strawn- Chair



The first weekend of October saw a small crew that hiked to Casa Vieja Meadow to take down the cattle exclusion fence that protects the meadow and allows the population of Golden Trout to flourish. For clarification, the fence is taken down due to the fierce winters at this altitude which would blow down the fence post and make the job of maintaining the fence difficult.

Due to the drought, they chose not to fish for the Golden Trout. Gary also reported that the South Fork of Kern River was bone dry at Kennedy Meadows along with Fish Creek. Luckily the water flow at the meadows looked good by comparison.

Locally, San Luis Rey River will be tested by our volunteer teams as part of the Southern California Steelhead Trout Project. We should all hope for a very wet winter this year for the sake of all local water sources.

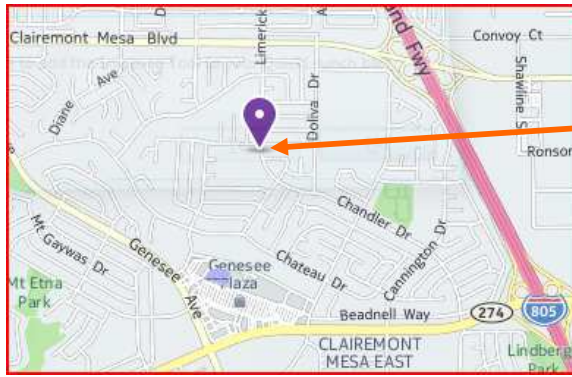

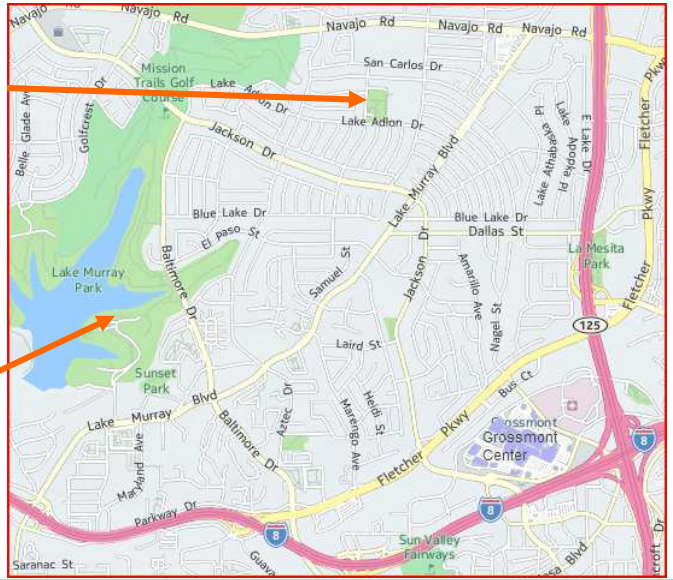

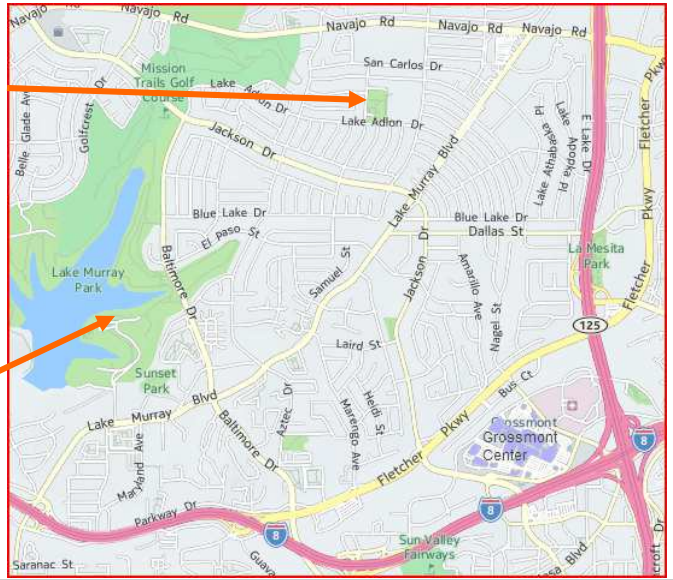
